Townsend Leather® is produced from bull and steer hides that are sourced and tanned in Europe, then dyed and finished in the USA at our manufacturing facility in upstate New York. Tanning reclaims hides from the waste stream of meat production and recycles them into high quality leather. The tanning process is strictly regulated in Europe to assure minimal impact on the environment.

The dyeing and finishing processes that transform the unadorned tanned hide from the equivalent of greige goods into the beautiful colors and textures of *Townsend Leather*® are also closely regulated in the US. Townsend uses vegetable based re-tanning agents and water-based finishing systems in its entire leather making. Effluent waters are monitored and pre-treated before they leave our factory to remove any compounds that do not meet state and federal standards, and then receive additional purification in a state-of –the-art wastewater treatment facility engineered to meet the needs of the leather industry, assuring complete environmental compliance.

Townsend Leather[®] is a durable, long-lasting product that does not require replacement or reprocessing in order to retain its beauty and serviceability. Unlike most other fabrics and textiles, *Townsend Leather*[®] may be easily repaired and restored to its original condition when worn or damaged, thereby further extending its useful life – replacement, and therefore new manufacturing, is often not required.

Leather is mankind's oldest textile and is naturally durable. Leather can handle wear and tear that would easily destroy other materials. It is estimated that leather lasts an average of 4 times longer than fabric coverings; the endurance of leather is unmatched.
